



Pope John Paul II Award



ZAMBIA IMMERSION PROGRAMME

The night of Tuesday December 6th was a special night for our school. In the Red Cow Moran Hotel, before an enthusiastic and enthralled crowd of more than 700, our school hosted a 'Strictly Come Dancing' event as the major fundraiser to support our school's second Immersion Programme to Zambia.

38 dancers, among them teachers, parents, past pupils and friends of the school gave unselfishly of their time and so much more over a 6 week period to make the night such an incredible success and empowered everyone connected with the Immersion Programme. All 38 are special people. We will never forget what they have done for us.

Immersion seeks to raise awareness of development issues in a positive and challenging way. In May 2017, 16 of our students will travel to Zambia in Southern Africa on Immersion for 2 weeks. They will be accompanied by 3 teachers along with Sarah Thompson, a past pupil and a member of our school's first Immersion Programme in 2008, also in Zambia. Our students are being offered a once in a lifetime opportunity which we trust they will enjoy and make the most of. They will be challenged, they will learn, they will share their talents, they will empower. Our school community and the environment of Drimnagh will benefit from their being part of this great adventure. We trust they will represent the very best of where they come from and make their families proud, make us all proud!

Whilst on Immersion, we will be involved in a number of projects over our 2 weeks in Zambia;

- Assisting with and presenting classroom based activities in Maths, English, Art & Crafts and Sport in three primary schools in the Livingstone area, mainly with 4th class boys and girls.
- Preparing for and delivering a Business English programme to 18/19 year old girls who have returned to full time education. All our students will be on a panel of interviewers offering jobs at the end of this course.
- Assisting with the work of Irish Missionary Sisters and health care workers in a daily health clinic along with travelling (on foot) to visit older people in their homes in outlying villages.
- Evening activities and games with young orphan children.
- Some students will be given the opportunity to visit a farm in Africa.
- Visiting students their own age in their homes, meeting their families, learning some language, maybe tasting the native food of this beautiful country, 'Nsima'.
- Representing our country in an away sports friendly probably netball.
- Participating in some cultural exchanges in a variety of settings.
- Telling our story and where we come from.
- A debate against a team from St. Raphael's Secondary School in Livingstone on a chosen topic. Mr. Cronin (Room 17) was a teacher in this school for 2 years.

There is so much more – but one event we all look forward to is launching a plaque in memory of one of our teachers, Linda Byrne who passed away in October 2007.

There is a very special building dedicated to Linda's memory in Livingstone. It is an oratory attached to the hospice and it will be on one of the walls of the oratory that our plaque will be placed in May.

We have so much to look forward to! Do encourage our students who are about to undertake this incredible journey. Wish them well. We look forward to telling you our story on our return.
