

Timothy Radcliffe, OP



Timothy Radcliffe, OP is a Catholic priest and Dominican friar of the English Province, and former Master of the Order of Preachers from 1992-2001. He is the only member of the English Province of the Dominicans to have held the office since the Order's foundation in 1216.

Before he became Master of the Dominican Order, Fr. Radcliffe had been the Prior Provincial of the Dominicans in England. He is a member of the Dominican priory at Blackfriars, Oxford and an internationally renowned and highly sought after speaker.

He was the 2007 winner of The Michael Ramsey prize for theological writing, for this book *What Is the Point of Being A Christian?* His other publications include *I Call You Friends*, *Seven Last Words and Why Go to Church?* *The Drama of the Eucharist*.

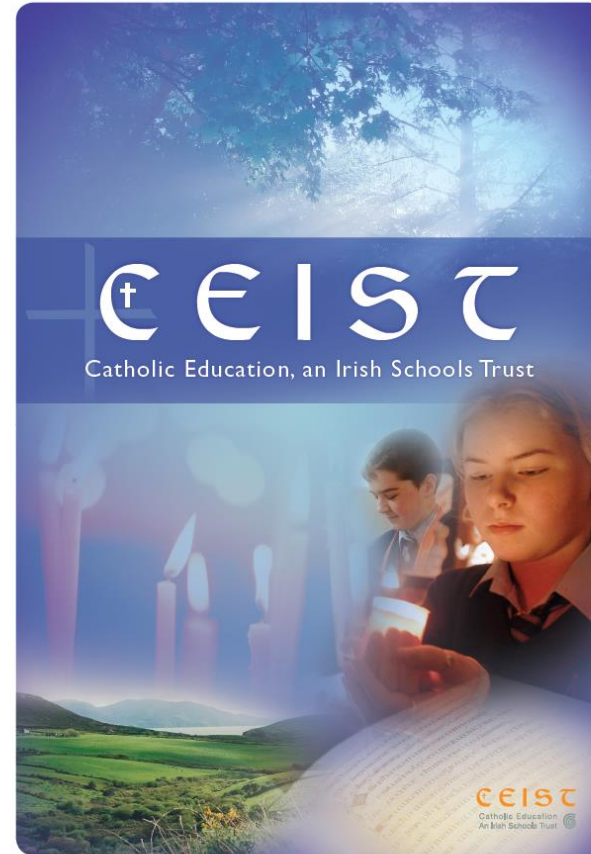
