### New School Planned for Presentation Secondary School, Miltown, Co. Kerry

### Transition Year Students organised a cake sale to raise funds for Pieta House

**Pieta House** is an organisation which provides counselling and support for people who are suicidal or self harming.

Pieta House, The Centre for the Prevention of Self-Harm or Suicide officially opened its doors in January 2006. 5 years later, it has seen and helped nearly 4,000 people, and opened up two Outreach Centres, and two other Centres of Excellence in both Dublin and Limerick. In five years, Pieta House has grown to almost 40 therapists and admin staff, and the demand for its service hasn't let up.

### Art Exhibition

Through the medium of art, students at Mary Immaculate organised an **Art Exhibition** entitled **See SAW**. The exhibition contained paintings and drawings from junior and senior cycle students. The recurring theme in the work was one of Hope. There is always hope, even when you feel it is a hopeless situation. Talking it out and opening up to someone you trust can save your life.

During this week of SAW, Transition Year Students designed a **wristband** which went on sale to students and the wider school community. It is a silicone yellow wristband, representing the light of **hope**, with the words See Saw @ MISS. The Pieta House web address is also inscribed on the inside of the band. All proceeds of the sales will go to Pieta House, who has five centres around the country.

**Liam St. George** a Transition year Student underwent a personal challenge at the end of October; when he did a charity skydive for the **William Winder Rainbow Foundation**. William Winder was a young boy who sadly died by suicide last June. The foundation was set up in his memory to help young people who are depressed or suicidal.

### Sports Day

The **fifth year** students who organised a sports day last May in the School and raised 510 Euros, decided that the William Winder Foundation would be a worthy local charity to give their funds to, so last Wednesday Ciaran Flanagan, Catherine Guerin and Liam St. George presented Mark Winder, Williams's dad, with the cheque. Mr Winder was delighted with the support from the school and commented on its efforts to raise awareness and educate students around the area for positive mental health.

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## New School Planned for Presentation Secondary School, Miltown

Tuesday 27th November 2012

Presentation Secondary School, Miltown, Co. Kerry is expected to have a 600 pupil new school completed in two years.

It will replace a school with 17 pre-fab classrooms (two thirds of the total) and which has a split campus on both sides of the main street.

Every 40 minutes, 200 pupils have to cross the street, on the busy Killarney to Dingle Peninsula tourist route, to get to their classes.

Mr Cormac Bonner, School Principal said the development would be a "great step forward" not least on health and safety grounds - an important factor in getting the go-ahead for the development.

"The new school has been made possible due to the purchase of a site by the Presentation Sisters who have been in Milltown since 1834," said Mr Bonner, the first lay Principal and an All-Ireland winning Tipperary hurler. A design team recently visited the site of the €6m-Plus facility, adjacent to the current school site.

The building will include a full-sized physical education hall, state-of-the-art facilities, with the most up to date classroom equipment and technology. All the necessary ancillary services are included.

The Department of Education and Skills included the project in a list of new schools announced in 2010.

Current enrolment is 548 pupils, but the new school will be built to cater for 600 allowing for an increase in numbers from the expanding Milltown catchment area in mid-Kerry.

Mr Bonner said that construction would start in Aug 2013. Staff and students are expected to move into the new building in December 2014.

The go-ahead for the 6, 500 Sq M school had been sought since 1996.

Ministers Ruairi Quinn and Pat Rabbitte joined forces to launch the new 'Energy in Education' initiative to help schools manage energy costs and potentially save €6m over the next year.

Developed by the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI), in collaboration with the Department of Education and Skills, the web-based initiative provides a vital service to help schools make energy savings requiring little or no capital expenditure.

"It's great to see schools working towards a more sustainable future for themselves as well as shaping and influencing future generations."

Also at the launch today, Pat Rabbitte T.D., Minister for Communications, Energy and Natural resources noted, "I am very focused on reducing the energy bill of the public sector and education is a significant part of that.

"This new initiative gives schools the tools to manage their own energy, with great opportunities to make significant savings. It's a real demonstration of what can be achieved with little or no capital expenditure required."

SEAI's Chief Executive, Dr Brian Motherway, added, "The Energy in Education initiative is a great tool for schools and provides them with the opportunity to not only manage their energy use but learn how to become more sustainable."

"What I particularly like is that the initiative helps to reduce the environmental impact of the school, while also teaching students about good energy using behaviour."

The programme, available to all schools who sign up to workshops and online supports via the website [www.energyineducation.ie](http://www.energyineducation.ie), takes participants through a five step process to implement energy management, offering a school the unique opportunity to learn about energy management with a view to implementing and making continued savings themselves.

To date SEAI has worked with over 250 schools aiding them to make savings in excess of €800k on energy bills through a number of energy saving supports.

All award recipients, along with their families and teachers, were congratulated by the Mayor and by the School Principal. Members of the Board of Management and many school staff also attended on the night.


Following the presentation of awards, the School Principal, Mary Ryan, thanked students, parents and staff for their support of student participation in all activities.

A series of stunning art pieces, depicting life in Presentation College, Carlow over the course of a year, are on display in Carlow Visual Arts Centre.

The exhibition by artist Blaise Smith runs in the centre until 6th January 2012 before moving to the Crawford Art Gallery in Cork and finally coming back to Carlow, where they will take pride of place in Presentation College, Askea, Carlow.

The Transition Year project was the culmination of an awareness-raising campaign around the issues of mental health and depression.

It was a fundraiser for the Aware charity, a world-record attempt and a triumph of teamwork and cooperation.
