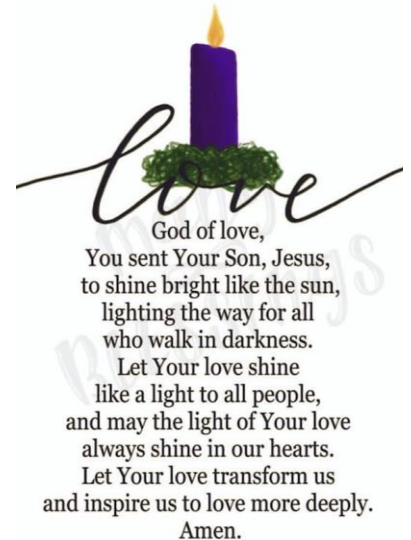


## Fourth Sunday in Advent – 18<sup>th</sup> December 2022



The birth of Jesus is now imminent and we are about to celebrate Christmas very soon. In a few days' time we will be celebrating the memory of that great event. On this, the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle, called the "**Angel's Candle**" to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Saviour. The fourth Sunday of Advent symbolises **Love**. All four candles will be lit on our Advent wreath and we will have a full circle of light. The Lord brings the light of love to his people by sending His only Son to earth for our salvation.

At this stage the anticipation is building, Christmas is coming very soon and Advent is already ending. Probably almost all preparations have been made or we are busy rushing around finalising the last-minute tasks. But have we made the most important preparation of all? Part of the meaning of Christmas is that by contemplating the experiences of Jesus and Mary, we learn from them how to say an unqualified and unconditional Yes. Because that is where the real joy and happiness of Christmas lies.....All the rest is just tinsel.

### Over to you.....

A good question to ask ourselves now is, how has our Advent journey been so far? Has it been meaningful and fruitful for us? Has it been good in preparing ourselves for the upcoming celebration of the Nativity or the birth of Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ? Or have we instead been preparing ourselves for Christmas in the wrong way?

As we approach the celebration of Christmas, offer thanks to God this week for the greatest gift of all, Jesus Christ. And, in celebrating Christmas, strive to focus your attention on Jesus, rather than the consumerism and commercialism of this time of year. Take time in prayer to give thanks for the blessings you have been given.
